

Emailed to City Councilmembers - June 26, 2016

Ladies and Gentlemen,

As our Coalition continues examining Charter Review Commission (CRC) history and environment, we confirm the corruption alleged earlier -- corruption defined as "the exploitation of the many by the politically powerful for the benefit of the few, obscuring financial reality by using bureaucratic power to avoid transparency and accountability."

**Revelation #29** attached is pivotal, contrasting what the Sculley/Nirenberg/Segovia bloc has told you, with the reality provided by our Coalition and another outside source:

1. We have never seen one of you at a Charter Review Commission meeting; you are, therefore, getting CRC information through City Attorney Segovia to whom the CRC reports.

2. As San Antonians, we are embarrassed to resort to the Resolution establishing the City of Austin's CRC, using it as a model for our CRC. The synoptic analysis enclosed summarizes the defects of our city's CRC, exposed by that comparison.

How does the Segovia/Sculley/Nirenberg story compare to the realities we offer for your review and verification? If our Sculley/Nirenberg/Segovia bloc has misled here, are you not obliged to ask whether you have been victims of fraud by omission in other areas?

Please expose any error or distortion we may have inadvertently published; we want to both require accountability and be accountable. You will want a credible source on which to rely; this scandal has a horizon that has not yet been established. We'll want to visit again.
